

# ONTARIO'S TIRE RECYCLING SYSTEM IS CHANGING

Tire collectors must register with the Authority starting September 4, 2018



## IF YOU DO NOT REGISTER, YOUR USED TIRES MAY NOT GET COLLECTED FOR RECYCLING

Beginning **January 1, 2019**, tire producers can only meet their collection targets with tires collected from registered collectors, municipalities or Crown sites.

The Used Tires Program operated by Ontario Tire Stewardship is ending on **December 31, 2018**. It will be replaced on **January 1, 2019** by a mandatory tire recycling system created by the Ontario government. The Resource Productivity and Recovery Authority was created to enforce these new requirements. To learn more, visit **rpra.ca/tires** 

### **REGISTRATION IS QUICK, EASY AND FREE**

Starting September 4, 2018, you can register at rpra.ca/registry

You must register by October 31, 2018.

You must register with the Authority as a tire collector if you operate:

- a site where used tires are collected and picked up for recycling or disposal
- an auto salvage or recycling site

You do not need to register as a tire collector if you:

- are a municipality or Crown site
- are a fleet operator
- collect tires and retread or process them at the same site (you would register as a retreader or processor)
